BARRY MURCHISON**

As many people living along the Gulf Coast and in East Texas who were in the path of Hurricane Ike can attest firsthand, life without electricity is difficult at best. Electricity, once considered a luxury for wealthy urbanites, is an integral part of modern society.

These days, we are so dependent on electricity in almost every aspect of life that an outage leaves businesses hobbled, traffic snarled and families not only in the dark, but also at the mercy of the elements.

Electric cooperatives like Lamar Electric know how much communities depend on their power lifeline. That's why co-op crews, with the help of workers from across Texas and other states, leapt into action in September to help restore electricity to members left powerless by Hurricane Ike, which left one co-op completely without power and nine others with outages over parts of their systems.

Hard work and smart planning by those co-ops paid off, and less than two weeks later, the lights were back on for all but a few individual members. Some customers of investor-owned utilities, on the other hand, endured blackouts that stretched into October.

The co-ops' quick turnaround not only is a credit to hard-working linemen and others, but it also demonstrates one of the advantages of electric cooperatives, which follow the principle of Cooperation Among Cooperatives. If disaster strikes, co-ops are there for one another just like a good neighbor would be.

Co-ops are also banding together to respond to another storm. This one is not one of Mother Nature's design, but a brewing one that could knock out our supply of reliable and affordable electricity.

Consider this: Few new generation plants are being built; demand for power, along with prices for fuel and materials, is rising; and uncertainty is growing about what pending rules to regulate so-called "greenhouse gas" emissions will mean for power producers. Although technology that makes renewable energy more cost-effective is being developed, wind and solar are still energy sources with only limited applications.

These factors combined put the long-term future of affordable power in question.

This is where you can help your cooperative and yourself. Contact the politicians making decisions that will affect your future and let them know how important it is that they keep you in mind when crafting energy policies.

Is Your Home Bundled Up for Winter?

Proper Insulation Is Key to Efficiency

One of the simplest ways to reduce your home's heating and cooling costs—and improve comfort—involves installing proper insulation. Doing so provides resistance to heat flow. The more heat-flow resistance your insulation provides, the lower your heating and cooling costs.

Heat flows naturally from a warmer to a cooler space. In winter, heat moves directly from heated living spaces to adjacent unheated areas and even outdoors. It can also travel indirectly through interior ceilings, walls and floors—wherever there is a difference in temperature.

To maintain comfort, heat lost in the winter must be replaced by your heating system. Proper insulation decreases heat loss.

Heat flow resistance is measured or rated in terms of its R-value. The higher the R-value, the greater the insulation's effectiveness.

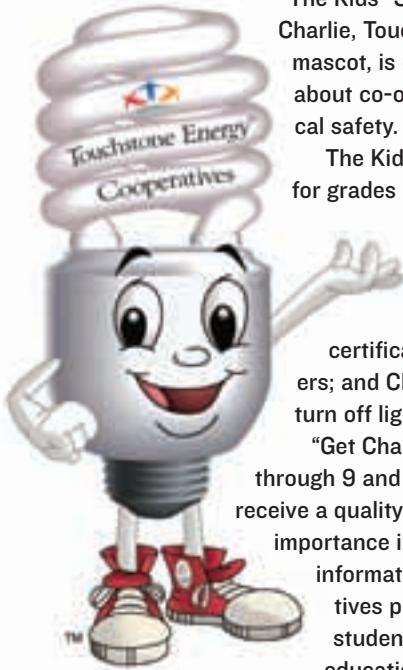
When calculating the R-value of multilayered insulation, add R-values of individual layers. Installing more insulation in your home increases the R-value.

The effectiveness of insulation also depends on how and where it's installed. For example, insulation that gets compressed will not provide its full rated R-value. The overall R-value of a wall or ceiling will be somewhat different from the R-value of the insulation because some heat flows around the insulation through studs and joists. Therefore, it's important to properly install your insulation to achieve the maximum R-value.

The Kids “Super Energy Saver” Classroom Kits, designed for grades 1 through 5, are packed with materials that will teach kids how to become “Super Energy Savers” at home, such as take-home checklists that walk kids and parents through their homes identifying energy-saving practices; Super Energy Saver certificates signed by CFL Charlie; activity sheets and folders; and CFL Charlie switchplate covers that remind kids to turn off lights when not in use.

“Get Charged! Electricity and You” is designed for grades 5 through 9 and is available to schools to make sure that students receive a quality education on electricity—from its beginnings to its importance in today’s world. By streamlining the vast amounts of information on electricity and the important role cooperatives played in bringing this commodity to rural America, students are able to easily digest the lesson plans in this educational campaign.

This program is made available through a partnership with Touchstone Energy Cooperatives and Discovery Channel School. The comprehensive kit of educational materials focuses on electricity, a component of the National Academy of Science’s National Science Education Standards (NSES). While individual states differ in their implementation and assessment of standards, they often base those for science topics on the NSES. Developed by teachers, scientists, science educators and other experts, the standards for grades kindergarten through 12 describe what students should understand and be able to do in various science categories.

“Providing our local schools with effective educational resources on electricity and the vital efforts rural electric co-ops put forth in bringing power to the people all across America exemplifies our commitment to community,” said Member Services Manager Laura Williams. “By investing in our local students’ education, we ensure that our customers, both households and businesses, can continue to count on us to provide them with more than just electricity.”

LEVEL BILLING PLAN CAN HELP YOU BUDGET BILLS

Residential members' electric usage varies throughout the year, leading to fluctuations in their electric bills. This variance can make family budgeting difficult. Many Lamar Electric Cooperative members receive higher bills during the winter and summer months, while spring and fall usually bring the lowest power bills.

Members of Lamar Electric Cooperative may qualify for the co-op's Level Billing Plan. This plan basically allows the member to pay an average amount each month throughout the year, eliminating the high bills associated with higher winter and summer power usage. Level Billing Plan participants must also realize that they will be paying MORE during some months than their actual usage.

With the plan, the member's account is settled in full each December. The Level Billing Plan amount is automatically reviewed and adjusted each January to reflect the member's



most recent usage history.

To participate in the plan, members must have been a cooperative customer for at least 12 months. The account must be in good standing with a satisfactory payment history.

Upon approval, the member will pay the same amount, as determined by the cooperative each month. The December bill will be an amount that brings the member's bill to a "fully paid" status.

If the plan is terminated, a settle-

ment is required to clear the account. If electric service is terminated by the cooperative for past-due amounts, the entire amount owed must be paid prior to restoration of service and the plan is automatically terminated.

Each month, the member's bill denotes the amount to be paid to satisfy the Level Billing Plan agreement, the member's actual monthly usage and the status of payments compared to billing to that point. This allows members to keep up with the actual status of their bill from month to month.

The Level Billing Plan takes the surprise out of your seasonal electric bill and gives you, the member, the control you need to help plan your family budget.

Don't Get Burned by Energy Scams

The devices could not be simpler—small gray boxes that plug into an electrical outlet in the home. The accompanying advertising insisted that these products, costing up to \$300, could shrink electric bills by 10 percent and reduce energy consumption by 25 percent. In times of rising energy prices, who wouldn't want to try them?

In May 2008, the Texas Office of the Attorney General took legal action against the firm offering what it called the Xpower Energy Saver or Mega Power Saver, which sell for \$200 and \$300, respectively. A lab at the University of Texas at Austin tested the

units and concluded that they could not live up to their promises.

In addition, the lab revealed that the products are, in reality, ordinary capacitors. Capacitors are regularly used by electricians, and they can be purchased for less than \$20.

Electric cooperatives warn consumers to beware of such claims.

"When energy prices go up, people get flooded with ads about gadgets and gizmos that claim to save money," said Larry Williams of Lamar Electric Cooperative. "We urge people to check with us first before they buy these products."

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) also warns consumers to be careful about marketers or home-improve-

ment contractors aggressively trying to sell energy-saving products. According to the agency, consumers should look carefully and check independent information—such as from state or local consumer protection offices like the Better Business Bureau—about companies selling such items.

"Don't fall for high-pressure sales pitches from contractors or door-to-door salespeople," says the FTC.

Williams reminds consumers of the role that their electric co-op can play in helping them to lower energy costs.

"Your electric cooperative is your advocate," Williams concludes. "We are here to help you make sense of energy-savings claims and also help you find real ways to save on your electric bill."
